Use This Incident-To Checklist to Breathe Easier During an Audit

You don't need to second-guess the way you bill your NP's services anymore

Pin down Medicare's criteria for billing your nurse practitioner's (NP) services "incident-to" your internist - and you can nab an extra 15 percent in reimbursement on each claim.

The basic guidelines for billing Medicare under the incident-to provision are:

- 1. Your NP must be the physician's employee or leased employee;
- 2. The services are within the NP's scope of practice;
- 3. The NP must provide the services in a private office setting;
- 4. The physician must perform the initial visit and subsequent established visits for the patient's acute new problems;
- 5. The physician must provide direct personal supervision of the NP's services to the patient; and
- 6. The physician must have an active part in the patient's ongoing care.
