Dear Mr. Attorney General:

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Inspector General (OIG), received your office's request to review the amended Georgia False Medicaid Claims Act, Ga. Code Ann. §§ 49-4-168 through 49-4-168.6, under the requirements of section 1909 of the Social Security Act (the Act). Section 1909 of the Act provides a financial incentive for a State to enact a law relating to the submission of false or fraudulent claims to the State Medicaid program. For a State to qualify for this incentive, the State law must meet certain requirements enumerated under section 1909(b) of the Act, as determined by the Inspector General of Health and Human Services in consultation with the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ). After consulting with DOJ, we have determined that the amended Georgia False Medicaid Claims Act meets the requirements of section 1909 of the Act.

Any further amendment to the Georgia False Medicaid Claims Act could affect OIG's determination that it meets the requirements of section 1909 of the Act. Therefore, please notify OIG of any amendment to the Georgia False Medicaid Claims Act within 30 days after such amendment.
