Update on Myocardial Infarction Treatment and Prevention segueing into Broken Heart Syndrome (Takotsubo Cardiomyopathy)

Myocardial infarction and cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in the United States. This talk summarizes current interventional treatment and prevention of acute MI. Broken Heart Syndrome (a.k.a stress-induced cardiomyopathy) presents similar to MI and usually occurs in post menopausal women. We'll discuss the characteristics of this syndrome in detail.

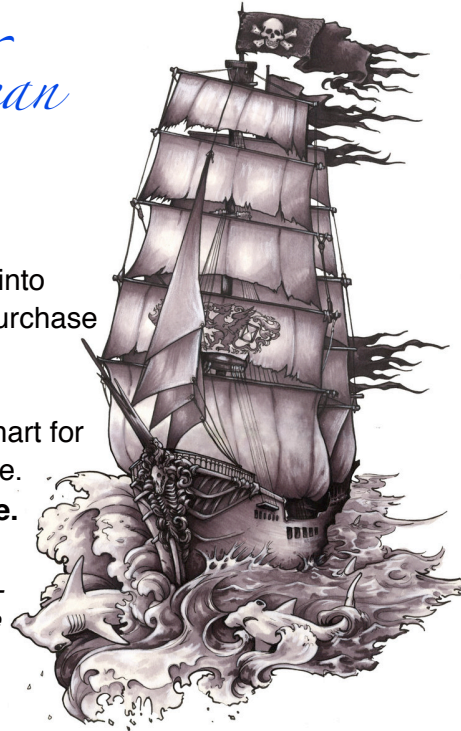
Coding In The Inpatient World - The Key to a Financially Successful Hospital

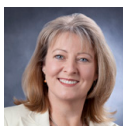

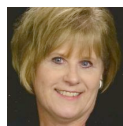
Susan Willis, President, Innovative Practices

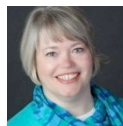
Linda R. Farrington, CPC, CPMA, CPC-I AHIMA Certified ICD-10-CM Trainer
